# 6th Grade Bulldawg Block - Poetry

# Time frame: 6 weeks/B days/Approximately 15 school days

Targeted Standard(s): What is the specific content that needs to be enriched?

- 2. Students will recognize and understand that poetry expresses and evokes different emotions by using sensory images, movement, sound, voice, etc.
- 3. Students will recognize and understand that poetry is written in specific structure, every aspect of a poem has a purpose.

#### Essential Questions connected to the big ideas:

- 1. What is Poetry? What are the different types of poetic forms?
- 2. How do you read a poem? How do you make sense of poetry?
- 3. How do you write a poem? What are the rules that apply to the different forms of poetry?

### Content/Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- Recognize, understand, analyze and identify poetry and its many poetic forms.
- Read different forms of poetry using voice, expression and emotions.
- Write different forms of poetry using specific poetic forms and formulas.
- Identify as a writer/poet.

#### Instructional Actions:

Daily Do Now - read a poem on Promethean Board and record initial thoughts in digital notebook. Daily Do Next - read poem aloud with class and discuss initial thoughts - what is it about? Point of view? Figurative language etc.

Mini Lesson - focusing on types of poetry, figurative language, literary elements, etc.

Poem Analysis - Read another poem focusing on content from mini lesson.

Write Poetry - students will write an original poem based on either the type of poem or poetic device learned in class.
