Delsea Regional High School Music Department Music Tech 1 Course Syllabus

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Course Description

Music Tech 1 is a semester class open to any student in grades 9-12 and is designed as an overview to and hands on experience with GarageBand and other music related hardware and software products. Knowledge of Mac computers is helpful but not required. Class time is devoted to gaining a practical understanding of GarageBand and applying it effectively in the areas of composition, recording, performance, and education. Students must supply their own headphones.

Objectives

The students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the basic music elements of rhythm, meter, and tempo. They will work with computer based music loops and utilize a basic musical vocabulary.

The students will comprehend and apply the use of music loops (real & software) to compose and arrange various projects.

The students have the ability to utilize creative means to compose music in a variety of styles and possess the basic computer skills to publish compositions and projects to a Podcast and to iTunes.
