Content

Skills

- Explore and analyze various cultures use of designs and their assorted mediums for the creation of fabric design.
- Evaluate and distinguish the differences between the art of varous cultures.
- Investigate the use of batik.
- Investigate form vs function in these indigineous cultures.
- Introduce proper fiber-based art techniques.
- Interpret and distinguish the use of the Elements of Art: line, shape, and color within indigenous fabric designs.
- Interpret and distinguish the use of the Principles of Designs of: pattern, rhythm, and unity within indigenous fabric designs.
- Discover different color schemes and how they can be effectively used in works of art.
- Create multiple color stories based on the color wheel that will be applied to the original creation.
- Create multiple fabric design sketch studies inspired by indigenous designs and applying: rhythm, unity, pattern, line, shape and color.

- Explore block printing, the creation and application.
- Explore the use of batik, the creation and application
- Create an original fabric design work of art utilizing basic drawing techniques and block printing/batiking.
- Develop a respect for the care of tools, equipment, supplies, through known safety practices.
- Assess and critique the original work of art.
- Demonstrate the reasonable use of time in the completion of an assignment.
- Utilize mounting techniques and the understanding of how to frame a work of art.
