Enduring Understandings

Students will examine one contemporary issue in depth to form an individual understanding and opinion, of the historical and current path, American government and law is travelling with respect to immigration, intellectual property or terrorism.

Essential Questions

IMMIGRATION:

- What are the processes and procedures involved in obtaining USA citizenship?
- What is the current public policy for dealing with immigrants in America without legal status?
- Which level of government is responsible for immigration policy enforcement, the federal, state or both?

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

- How do patents, trademarks and copyright protect intellectual property?
- What are the challenges dealing with counterfeit goods?
- How has the world-wide-web become a grey area with respect to intellectual property?

TERRORISM:

- What are the American and international rules and laws concerning war with other states?
- How do the rules for war apply to terrorism and fighting a non-state actor?
- How is American to balance security interests with individual freedoms?

Skills

IMMIGRATION:

- Explain the requirements for the American naturalization process.
- Distinguish visitors and lawful residents with undocumented immigrants.

- Identify the requirements for asylum.
- Explain the federal and state powers in regards to immigration policy and enforcement.
- Form individual opinion on the current American immigration policy.
- Debate proposals for immigration policy and enforcement.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

- Explain the purpose and protection provided with patents, trademarks and copyrights.
- Examine the impact of counterfeit goods on American consumers, businesses and the government.
- Explain the laws currently outlining intellectual property on the internet and social media.
- Form opinions on the ownership of intellectual properties and ideas through the world-wide web.

TERRORISM:

- Explain the Patriot Act of 2001 and how updated in 2008.
- Analyze how the Patriot Act extends the government's reach in respect to search and seizure?
- Discuss the role drones have played in the war against terror.
- Explain the rules for detainment and torture of suspected terrorists.
- Form opinions on the historic and current practices of torture.
