## **Enduring Understandings**

When understanding the causes of home disasters, we will be well equipped to prevent and/or respond to them in emergency situations.

## **Essential Questions**

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What is harm or loss and how can it be prevented?

How can we prevent unnecessary fires both in our homes and our environment?

How can we learn about and prepare for weather emergencies?

Why is it beneficial to know basic first aid and/or steps to take in an emergency?

## **Content**

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Harm, Loss, Accident, Emergency, Safety, Risks, Exit Plans, Protective Factors, Self-Defense, Assertive, Bullying, Harassment, Due Dilligence, Internet Safety

## **Learning Objectives**

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Discuss the steps in the accident chain and determine how to break the cycle to prevent accidents.

Compare and contrast personal safety in a variety of different public places such as school, mall, sporting event, or concert.

Determine risk factors for a fire and how to minimize home risk

Design a home exit plan with meeting place and multiply exits per room so that prepared for an emergency

Assess what steps need to be taken in order for home exit plan to be effective (purchase fire ladder, fire extinguisher)

Analyze types of weather emergencies and determine the impact they may have

Determine where the safest place would be in a variety of different weather emergencies

Assess basic first aid necessity during minor injuries and illness
