Transfer Skills

Understand there are still issues of gender equity today.

Students will also hypothesize how modern day issues can be solved and what new frontiers women will enter into in the future.

Enduring Understandings

Assess women's contributions throughout history and examine why women are often absent from historical texts.

Identify women who have broken social and cultural barriers.

Women are often underrepresented in news coverage and, on television shows, are stereotypically portrayed when they are included.

Girls who play sports are more socially well-adjusted than girls who don't giving them entry into an achievement-based social network.

Women have often been shut out of careers and activities that were traditionally considered 'male'.

Essential Questions

How has this course affected the way you perceive women in society?

Why did you choose your specific athlete to further research?

What do you think we could do as a society to better the negative implications female athletes receive?

Do you feel that you have had to overcome any obstacles or challenges as a female athlete?
