Students will be able to:

- Explore and analyze the historical evolution of fashion through westernized culture.
- Evaluate and distinguish the differences between fashion of various time periods.
- Investigate how fashion was a reflection of historical events.
- Investigate the use of croakies.
- Sketch and create fashion drawings.
- Interpret and distinguish the use of the Principles of Designs and Elements of Art in fashion and how they are universal building blocks for all types of art.
- Apply knowledge of historical fashion design to creating a design based on an era.
- Create multiple fashion design sketches inspired by a specific era.
