Transfer Skills

There are a variety of influences that can help predict the news we view, and produce.

We should account for the factors influencing us as producers, and the qualities of news whenever we are producing.

Essential Questions

Why can ownership or censorship effect you as a producer?

Why might one quality of news gain more viewership over another?

What societal or school based influences may influence you as a producer?

Why is it important to understand the factors that influence the media?
