Enduring Understandings

Mixed media is usually regarded as an 20th century art form, however throughout history of painting works have been produced successfully combining a range of likely and unlikely materials.

Collage, like any other art form, needs to be held together with a visual theme, either by a dominant color, an emphasis on contrasting textures, or a linking concept such as landscape.

Collaging photographic imagery has become a mainstream contemporary art form that is both a product and mirror of our technological age.

collage, frottage, chenille-stem painting, paper construction, template, bone folder, pva glue, acrylic paints, acrylic matte and gloss sealers, modeling paste, fusion fibers, tyvek paper, altered books, surface decoration.
