Enduring Understandings

For a book to sell, the cover is key. The finest books boast strong, well-written stories, but to rise to the top and gain traction with readers, even the best books need a dynamic cover.

A book's cover is the first thing a potential reader sees and it can make a lasting impression because our brains are wired to process images faster than words.

A great cover can help a reader instantly recognize that a book is for them and therefore, there is a clear connection between great covers and great sales.

Quality book covers are easily read, have a distinctive typography, and there is a harmonious cohesion between the design elements and the market – the art should not fight the typography.

The design elements that are most important in book design include simplicity, a clear promise (maybe through a blurb), a professional design with layers and smart use of color, readable text and appropriate targeting (if you strip away the words – the buyer should still understand the promise that the imagery is making about the text inside the book).
