Enduring Understandings

Successful illustrations for children books will convey the story without text.

Character development in illustration can provoke thought and curiosity among readers.

Use of reference photos for accurate sketches are crucial, and when combined with new ideas and other imagery, are not considered plagiarism.

Color and value are essential art elements that must be used to create promising illustrations.
