Play chords with rhythmic accuracy.

Play Blues chord progressions in keys of A, D, E, G.

Play and improvise with minor pentatonic scale over the Blues.

Play accidentals and enharmonics on the instrument.

Play and improvise with minor pentatonic scale over the Blues.
