Enduring Understandings

Music uses many devices in order to create variety and expression devices. These pertain to timbre, tempo, dynamics and articulation.

In order to play more expressively on the instrument, certain techniques need to be developed (slurs, staccato, etc.)

The ability to construct, identify and perform varied scales improves musicianship.

Essential Questions

How do musicians describe timbre, dynamics, tempo and articulation?

Why are Italian terms the worldwide standard for many expressive musical devices?

How can we use a variety of techniques in order to better express ourselves?

How can we better understand the detailed directions of composers to the performer?

How does knowing a variety of scales improve basic musicianship?

Content

VOCABULARY:

Dynamics (ff, f, mf, mp, p, pp, cresc. decresc.), Tempo (Allegro, Andante, Largo), articulation (Slur, Ligado, hammer-on, pull-off, staccato, legato, etc.), timbre; Major Pentatonic, Minor Pentatonic, Natural minor scale, Harmonic minor scale, Melodic minor scale, Jazz minor scale.

Skills

Investigate and interpret a piece of music in terms of tempi, dynamics, timbre, and articulation.

Critique a musical performance in terms of the expressive devices in this unit.

Compose an etude which uses these expressive devices.

Build, identify and perform minor and pentatonic scales.
