Investigate the use of the elements and principles of art in three-dimensional ceramic work.

Develop an understanding of critique by viewing student examples and master works of art.

Discover how multiples of ceramic pieces can be made through processes like molding, casting, and throwing.

Explore the use of non- traditional tools to get desired effects.

Create clay mock ups prior to undertaking a finished project.

Plan two-dimensional sketches of projects to further help in understanding how to build those objects.

Reinforce score and slip, blending, and other important techniques for attachment.

Implement proper glazing procedure and practice.

Produce several glazing tests and samples which will be used throughout the course by the entire class as means for comparison and understanding.

Reinforce a respect for the care of tools, equipment, supplies, through known safety practices.
