## **Learning Objectives**

---

Grade 6 performs scales in one octave up to 3 sharps, using detache, slurred and separate bowings.

Grade 7 & 8 perform scale in two octaves up to 3 sharps and perform all other scales in one octave, using a variety of detached, slurred and separate bowings. Students will also demonstrate the beginnings of vibrato.

Grade 6-8 demonstrates knowledge of historical time periods and musical styles, basic string technique.

Gr. 6-8 tunes instruments independently.
