Course Overview

The fifth grade social studies curriculum delves deeper into early American history. Students begin the year by studying the impact of European exploration on North America and the subsequent early settlement of America. From there, students see how settlers interacted and sometimes conflicted as they look at colonial life. From there, the curriculum moves into a study of the causes and course of the American Revolution and the development of the Constitution. In the final unit, students will take the knowledge that they learned from previous units, such as standing up for their beliefs, and apply it to issues dealing with prejudice and discrimination. The unit "Climbing Higher" will encourage students to evaluate historical times during which prejudice and discrimination were prevalent and develop personal strategies to learn to stand up for what they believe in.
