Course Overview

The sixth grade social studies curriculum provides students with their first introduction to world history. Beginning with early man, the curriculum then moves to ancient river civilizations such as Mesopotamia, Egypt, and the Indus River Valley. Students then begin to study the classical civilizations of Rome and Greece. Students then move to different areas of the world through their exploration of the Arabian Peninsula, Africa, Asia, and the Americas.

During the time that students are looking at different areas of the world during different historical time periods, students also look at sound of the foundational concepts of social studies such as geography skills, economics, the development of religions, and government structures. Students will repeatedly be asked to analyze the different civilizations and draw connections through comparing and contrasting of these early civilizations. Students will also be asked to develop their ability to articulate their thoughts orally through debate as well as in writing through the development of responses to document based questions.
