- "Cinco de Mayo" is a Mexican holiday that celebrates when the Mexicans beat the French in the Battle of Puebla
- "La Giralda" is Sevilla's best landmark, formerly a Islamic religious tower
- "La Sagrada Familia" is a famous church in Spain, known for its incredible architecture
- · "Paella" is traditional Spanish dish typically made up of rice and seafood
- Barcelona is Spain largest seaport and second largest city
- Chichen Itza was one of the largest Mayan cities
- Flamenco music is a traditional song and dance from Spain
- Granada is a small city in Andalucía and is home of the "Alhambra", a Moorish palace
- Guadalajara is Mexico's second largest city and is known for its pottery and crafts
- Jarabe Tapatío (mexican hat dance) is a traditional dance from Mexico
- lack of fresh water is one of Mexico's greatest problems
- Mariachi music is popular in Mexico: consisting of two violins, two trumpets and one Spanish guitar
- · Mérida is located on the Yucatán Peninsula in Mexico and is a major Mayan cultural center
- Mexicans celebrate "Day of the Dead" in remembrance of those who have passed
- Mexicans celebrate their independence on September 16th with parades and bands
- Mexico has mariachi bands: street strolling musicians
- Mexico is divided by the Sierra Madre mountain range which is a barrier for communication and transportation
- · Mexico is located in North America
- Mexico's economy is based largely on agriculture
- people in Barcelona speak Catalan, a mixture of French and Spanish
- Sevilla is one of Spain's largest cities and is situated on the Guadalquivir River
- Spain is located in Europe, next to Portugal and France
- the "Running of the Bulls" is when the bulls follow runners to a stadium in Pamplona, Spain
- the capital of Mexico is Mexico City and the capital of Spain is Madrid
- the Feria de Abril in Seville, Spain is a big festival where people dress up in traditional costume and sing and dance
- the indigenous groups in Mexico are the Aztecs and the Mayan
- the moors occupied Spain for many years and influenced Spain's architecture, music, religion and view
