# **Unit 3- America del Sur**

### **Unit Overview**

In this unit, students will learn basic facts about each Spanish-speaking country in South America. They will learn the capital and locations of all the Spanish-speaking countries, important sites and landmarks, the flag, currency, traditional foods, music, and basic historical facts.

## Application of Knowledge: Students will know that...

- Cumbia is traditional song and dance from Colombia
- each country's currency varies and has different value
- each Spanish-speaking country in South America has its own distinct culture
- Las Pampas are famous grasslands found in Argentina
- Machu Picchu is a famous Incan ruin
- Tango is a traditional song and dance from Argentina
- the Amazon rainforest is the world's largest tropical rainforest and is located in South America
- the Andes mountains are the longest and one of the highest mountain ranges in the world (located on

the western coast of South America)

- The Atacama Desert, found in Chile, is one of the driest places on the planet
- the different flags of South America tell us a little about the history of each country
- the Incas were indigenous people from Peru
- there are 9 Spanish-speaking countries in South America: Venezuela, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Paraguay, Chile, Argentina and Uruguay
- traditional foods vary from country to country

- describe and identify Machu Picchu
- describe important cities and landmarks in the different Spanish-speaking countries of South America
- · describe the history behind the different Hispanic flags of South America
- describe the Inca people and their civilization
- describe traditional foods
- identify different currencies from South America
- identify different traditional songs and dances
- identify important physical features: Andes Mountains, Las Pampas, the Atacama Desert and the Amazon rainforest
- · identify the capital of each country in South America
- · identify the different flags of South America
- · locate the countries of South America

- Formative: match the traditional food with the correct country of origin
- Formative: illustrate Machu Picchu and write a short paragraph describing this Incan ruin
- Formative: identify the pictures of the Andes Mountains, Las Pampas, the Atacama desert and the Amazon rain forest
- Summative: South America Project- create a video where students travel to three different Spanishspeaking countries and describe three different locations within those countries
- Summative: Create a website a travel website for a country in South America. Students must include different places to visit and fun facts about the country.

- create a practice test for another student to take
- show Power Points on the different countries of South America

- create a webquest where students will have to search the internet to answer questions about the different countries of South America
- write a paragraph about a country in South America they would like to visit
- play "Where in the World is Carmen Sandiego?" (South America)- give students clues to determine where Carmen Sandiego is located
