Unit Overview

In this unit, students will study the country of Spain. They will learn about the country's geographical regions, languages, and culture as expressed in its music and cuisine. They will also learn about Spanish customs and holidays, such as *la siesta* and *la feria*.

Essential Questions

What does *la siesta* tell us about Spain's culture and beliefs?

Why is it helpful to learn about other cultures and languages?

Application of Knowledge and Skills...

Students will know that...

- during La Feria, people celebrate Spanish culture by dressing in traditional clothing, by playing Flamenco music, by eating traditional foods, and by dancing
- in southern Spain, there is a week-long celebration called La Feria
- popular sports in Spain are soccer and bullfighting
- Spain is divided into 17 regions
- Spain is famous for Flamenco music and seafood dishes, such as Paella
- Spain is located on the Mediterranean Sea on the continent of Europe
- the languages spoken in Spain include: Castilian Spanish, Catalan, Basque, Valencian and Galician
- the people of Spain take a nap, known as la siesta, during the day
- the people of Spain typically have an afternoon snack called a merienda

Students will be able to...

- describe a typical Spanish day
- describe La Feria
- locate and describe two different regions in Spain
- locate Spain on a map
- name two popular Spanish sports
- recognize the names of the different languages spoken in Spain

Assessments

- Diagnostic: Other visual assessments
- Formative: Personal Project
- Pre-assessment
- Spanish Culture Project
- Spanish Unit Test
- Students answer multiple-choice questions about unit content.
- Students identify the Spanish cultural items projected on the Smart Board and locate Spain on a world map.
- Students work with a partner to present information on Spanish food, music, dancing or a city in Spain.
- Summative: Other written assessments

Activities

- Construct the Spanish flag
- Color and label the different regions of Spain on a map
- Listen to Spanish music and identify the different instruments that are typically heard
- Create a Spanish soccer jersey using a plain white or red shirt and fabric markers
- Create a Spanish Flamenco performance using castanets and guitars

- Take an imaginary trip through Spain using pictures projected onto the Smart Board
