Unit Overview

In this unit, students will learn clothing vocabulary and use it to ask and respond to questions about clothing, such as, "What is he or she wearing?" or "What do you wear in the winter?". In addition, students will learn the I, you (familiar) and he/she verb endings.

Essential Questions

How does traditional ethnic clothing represent one's country?

How does Spanish grammar differ from English?

How can you use this vocabulary when traveling to a Spanish-speaking country?

Application of Knowledge and Skills...

- Bullfighting attire originated in Spain
- Each Spanish-speaking country has its individual traditional dress
- Flamenco clothing originated in Spain
- Mexican and Central American women traditionally wear an huipil, a sleeve-less tunic
- Mexican men typically wear a sarape, a large cape
- The present-tense ending for he/she for AR verbs is "a"
- The present-tense verb ending for I is "o"
- The present-tense verb ending for you(familiar) is "as" for AR verbs
- To ask someone what they are wearing, use the phrase, ¿Qué llevas?
- To ask the color of clothing, say ¿Qué color es?
- To respond to a question about clothing color say, Es followed by the color name
- To respond to a question about what one is wearing, respond Llevo and state the name of the clothing

Students will be able to...

- answer and respond to questions about clothing in Spanish, written and orally
- conjugate the verb "llevar" in the I, you and he/she forms
- identify and express clothing vocabulary, written and orally
- recognize different cultural clothing

Assessments

- Clothing Test
- Diagnostic: Other visual assessments
- Draw a self-portrait and label one's outfit in Spanish; present to the class.
- Formative: Personal Project
- Label an outfit using a word bank and answer multiple choice questions about the outfit.
- Name the clothing items projected on the Smart Board; answer questions about the clothing.
- Outfit Project
- Pre-assessment
- Summative: Written Test

Activities

- describe different outfits that can be used for each of the four seasons and illustrate the outfits.
- play a game in which one student will describe the clothing a classmate is wearing and the class must determine which classmate is being described.
- identify the different cultural outfits projected on the board and the country with which each one is associated.

• watch an authentic clothing commercial in Spanish; record any familiar vocabulary and try to determine what is happening in the commercial.
