

# Unit 2: Numbers 1-100

## Unit Overview

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In this unit, students will review and learn numbers 1-100 in Spanish. They will answer and ask basic questions using numbers vocabulary. Students will also interpret and express addition and subtraction sentences in Spanish.

## Application of Knowledge and Skills...

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## Students will know that...

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- es is used for = when the answer is 1 or 0

- numbers 20-100 repeat numbers 1-9: treinta y uno (31), treinta y dos (32), treinta y tres (33)
- son is used for =
- to ask how many items there are, one uses Cuántos/Cuántas (depending on the item's gender) then states the item, followed by hay (there is/there are)
- to ask how much something costs, one uses Cuánto cuesta (How much does it cost), followed by the item
- to express a mathematical equation, one uses más or y for addition and menos for subtraction
- to respond to the question of how many, one begins with hay (there is/there are) then states the amount, followed by the item
- to respond to the question of how much something costs, begin with Cuesta (It costs), then state the amount, followed by the currency

## **Students will be able to...**

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- ask and respond to basic questions using numbers, orally and written
- express and recognize numbers 1-100, orally
- interpret and write subtraction equations in Spanish

## **Assessments**

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- Customer Skit
- Diagnostic: Other written assessments
- Formative: Dramatization
- Match the number with the correct Spanish word, solve addition and subtraction equations, and respond to multiple-choice questions using numbers vocabulary.
- Numbers 1-100
- Pre-assessment
- Summative: Written Test
- Translate the Spanish words, phrases, and questions in the word splash.
- Work with a partner to develop a skit where the customer asks the cost of various items and then purchase the items. The "store clerk" assists the customer and totals the items purchased.

## **Activities**

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- play "Caramba", a game in which students count by 10's as they take turns. The person after one hundred says, "Caramba" and must sit down.
- practice interpreting Spanish numerals by playing "la loteria", in which the teacher pretends to be a radio host and names the winning numbers for the lottery. The students write the numbers
- create flashcards to help memorize numbers vocabulary
- play a Bingo review game

- watch a video to review numbers vocabulary
- practice vocabulary using web flashcards
- play number vocabulary games
