

# Unit 1: Classroom and Commands

## Unit Overview

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In this unit, students will learn classroom objects vocabulary and understand classroom commands. Students will also follow classroom commands, such as, "walk to the board" and "open your books". This unit will also review masculine and feminine nouns.

## Application of Knowledge and Skills...

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## **Students will know that...**

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- ¿Dónde están? is used when the classroom objects are plural
- ¿Qué es esto? means "What is this?"
- If the object is plural, son is used instead of es and unos/unas instead of uno/una
- The nouns that do not follow the rule must be memorized
- To ask the color of the classroom object, one states the question, ¿Qué color es?
- to ask where something is, one says, ¿Dónde está...? followed by the item being sought
- to respond to the "where" question, one says (Classroom Object) Está aquí. (It is here.), and points to where the classroom object is located
- To respond to the color question, ones states, Es (It is), followed by the color
- To respond to the question about what an item is, one says, Es (It is) followed by un/una (depending if the word is masculine or feminine), then the classroom object
- un is masculine and una is feminine
- When a noun in Spanish ends in a, it is usually feminine
- When a noun in Spanish ends in o, it is usually masculine

## **Students will be able to...**

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- follow classroom commands
- recognize and express classroom vocabulary, written and orally
- recognize Spanish masculine and feminine nouns, written and orally
- respond to questions about classroom vocabulary, written and orally

- Pre-assessment
- Students answer multiple-choice questions about a paragraph read in class containing vocabulary related to commands and classroom objects.
- Students illustrate and label each classroom object. Students match the command with the correct Spanish translation. Students answer multiple-choice questions about classroom objects.
- Students will "be the teacher" and give classroom commands for others to follow. Students will also ask their classmates basic questions about classroom vocabulary.

- Using a word bank, write the correct Spanish word for the classroom object or command illustrated on the paper.

## Activities

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- play "I Spy" in Spanish to review classroom objects and colors vocabulary.
- learn a cultural rhyme that goes along with the "I Spy" game.
- illustrate the classroom and label it in Spanish
- create flashcards to review vocabulary
- write unit vocabulary and label the classroom in Spanish
