Activities

- Read and perform a simple dialogue in pairs.
- Prepare a short skit introducing yourself and others in groups of four.
- Play "Simon Says" with classroom commands.
- Ask a partner how to say a classroom object in Spanish.
- Work with a partner to take turns spelling words.
- Create "pen pals" within the class and have students write letters of introduction to each other.
- Complete SmartBoard matching activities for vocabulary.
- Practice numbers using math flashcards.
- Draw hands on blank clocks according to teacher-recited time.
- Complete SmartBoard activity labeling a human skeleton with the corresponding body parts.
- TPR activities Students respond appropriately to oral expressions (Ex: "Hace calor" students fan themselves).
- Use the Internet to research the seasons and climates in South America.
- Describe a season to a partner using the weather expressions in the target language and have partner name the season based on the description.
- Complete interactive activities in text "Para Empezar" chapter (pages 2-23).
- Complete worksheets from Teacher Guided Activities that correspond to the unit.
- Complete activities from practice and WAV workbooks.
- Play Bingo games for vocabulary review.
