- Conventions of writing (punctuation, simple sentence structure)

- Ask questions about what others have shared
- Answer simple questions

Topic 1.2 About My School

- Ask and answer questions about people and places
- Use the verbs is, am, are
- Ask and answer questions about time (what time, when it is, it's)
- Talk about schedules (use prepositions on, at, in)
- Describe actions with present tense verbs

- Make negative statements (don't/doesn't)
- Describe what you see (subject-verb agreement with there is/are)
- Follow classroom directions (commands)
- Use survival phrases (may I+verb)
- Identify and use classroom objects vocabulary
- Identify technology vocabulary and practice
- Continue identifying letters and sounds
- Follow a sequence (first, second, third)
- Use appropriate capitalization and punctuation
