Paper Quilling - Students will be able to:

-Create a work of quilled art

Embroidery - Students will be able to:

- -Build upon basic needlework including the running stitch and stem stitch
- -Understand what is embroidery, the historical background of embroidery & distinctive embroidery styles
- -Know about the different materials and tools needed for embroidery
- -Understand how basic embroidery stitches are made and how they are used

Macrame - Students will be able to:

-Learn various types of knot tying techniques

-Explore examples of macrame in use

-Create unique macrame works of art

Weaving - Students will be able to:

-Further expand upon basketry/textile weaving techniques introduced in prior area of study -Strengthen their understanding of overlapping and over/under as it applies to weaving -Learn how artists can use found objects/materials in their art

Mosaics - Students will be able to:

-Learn about the history of mosaic art
-Identify the key steps in creating a mosaic
-Familiarize themselves with glass cutting tools and techniques
-Create an original mosaic incorporating various materials

Batik - Students will be able to:

-Recognize the historical origins of this art form

-Create an original design based on historical knowledge of existing batik designs

-Identify different methods of design and technique
