Through modeling, students will demonstrate how to give cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for an adult, child or infant. **HE.9-12.2.1.12.CHSS - Community Health Services and Support - [Core Idea] - Affordability and accessibility of health care impacts the prevention, early detection, and treatment of health conditions.**
4. Assist students to understand the general steps for the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) and precautions when using an AED. **HE.9-12.2.1.12.CHSS - Community Health Services and Support - [Core Idea] - Affordability and accessibility of health care impacts the prevention, early detection, and treatment of health conditions.**
5. Empower students to recognize if an AED is needed and demonstrate how to care for sudden illnesses, including stroke, diabetic emergencies, poisoning and allergic reaction. **HE.9-12.2.1.12.CHSS - Community Health Services and Support - [Core Idea] - Affordability and accessibility of health care impacts the prevention, early detection, and treatment of health conditions.**

4. How could being a trained first aider have an impact on your future and the ones you love?
