- Students will use Historical Thinking Skills to evaluate sources and ideas. Comparison, Contextualization, Continuity and Change over Time, Periodization, Synthesis, Claims, Point of View, Intended Audience, and Purpose.
- Students will observe, note, and draw conclusions with the understanding that there are multiple perspectives. Multiple perspectives is the foundation to understanding the why and how of history. various aspects of media will be discussed, and the lowering standard of media as a reliable source of factual information

Essential Questions

- Why did Religion lose focus for people while education grew as a staple of social evolution?
- What is the lasting impact of Religion as a source of truth and as an counter to the truth sought in Education?
- What is the role of technology in the movement away from Religions education and to more of a fact-based education system?
- What are the ethical considerations of continuing the traditional model of Free Public education in the face of changing norms and realities?
