1. What are "Longevity noodles"? What kind of "fruit" symbolizes "Longevity"? What kind of "tree" symbolizes longevity?
2. What are the most proper and respectful well-wish idiomatic expressions for elderly people's birthday celebrations?

4. The expression of weekdays and “What day of the week is....?” - 星期一, 二, 三, 四, 五, 六, 日 (天); 星期几?
5. Temporal Order for time expressions – from the largest unit to the smallest
6. Telling-time key phrases – hour/half hour/quarter hour/minute 点、半、刻、分 and “What time do we meet?” – 我们几点见?
7. Pronouns as modifiers with the usage of possessive particle 的 – 她的老师; 我的医生; 你的生日
8. The sentence structure with the object of the 1st verb is also the subject of the 2nd verb - 明天她请我吃饭。
9. Alternative questions with conj “or” 还是, and conj “but” 可是
10. Daily-life expressions

- a). “How about that?” after making an suggestion – 怎么样？
- b). That’s great! - 太好了！
- c). Is that right? – 是吗？
- d). Thank you. – 谢谢！
- e). Good-bye – 再见！
- f). How old? – 多大？ 几岁？
