Enduring Understanding

- 1. Like conventional Photography Digital is about Seeing Imagery and translating it to a two-dimensional form.
- 2. Bright, realistic colors are commonplace, and the old unsaturated color or black and white are now special applications rather than the norm.
- 3. The digital darkroom is similar to traditional darkroom photography, the meaning of the photograph is paramount

Essential Questions

- 1. How do photographers utilize the technology of the camera and photographic software to create artistic expressions?
- 2. What role do studio environments and photographic paper play in the production and realization of photographic art?
- 3. How do these various technological and physical tools work together to empower artists in the creation of photographic art?

Knowledge and Skills

- Students will be able to identify and define the elements of art (line, shape, form, value, color, space, texture) and the principles of design (balance, unity, contrast, emphasis, pattern, movement, rhythm).
- Students will be able to recognize and apply these elements and principles, including concepts of vantage point and composition, in both existing photographic art and their own work.
- Students will be able to define and differentiate terms such as harmony, contrast, balance, and proportion, applying them in photographic analysis and creation.

- Students will be able to understand and apply the nature and effects of different focal lengths and fstops to determine optimal settings for various types of photography and in their own work.
- Students will be able to expand their use of Photoshop to include layers and advanced tools for digital image adjustment.

Resourses

- Camera technology and advanced usage.
- Advanced use of photoshop
- Printing on different papers.
- Using the studio; studio lighting.
- Present examples of work which exemplify the skill being addressed.
- Provide definitions of key terms, discuss new techniques, concepts and processes in terms of historical time period.
- Discuss work of definitive artists.
- Instruct on use of materials and new skills needed to generate art work in a given medium.
- Allow students to develop new skills through the creation of "studies" prior to creating art work.
- Provide feedback and suggestions for improvement.
- Lead critique sessions of both model work and student work using the appropriate terms and language focusing on the elements and principles of art and design and the medium being studied.
