## **Knowledge and Skills**

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- Students will be able to successfully capture documentary images, demonstrating attention to detail, vantage point, and timing.
- Students will be able to plan and compose portraits, considering lighting, framing, detail, and environment.
- Students will be able to create landscape photographs, effectively using natural light to establish mood and convey a message.
- Students will be able to recognize street photography as a form of documentary photography that reflects both personal vision and factual observation.
- Students will be able to plan and create photographs that communicate a message through metaphor, and differentiate between photojournalism and documentary photography by creating images that inform about an event.
- Students will be able to define surrealism and create images or series that present a fairy tale, fantasy, or humorous story, contrasting with realistic narratives.
- Students will be able to plan and create abstract images of concrete objects or scenes using light and distance.
- Students will be able to plan, execute, and create a narrative sequence of images that tell a "day-in-the-life" story.

- Students will be able to bind a series of related photographs (narrative or non-narrative) into a book form.
