## Knowledge and Skills

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Students will be able to:

- Demonstrate how relaxation and physical exercises will help when developing and working in an activity, presentation or performance.
- Understand a character in a play and describe the character in a biography.
- Define the nine stage areas and perform them in a Fairy Tale piece.
- Understand Greek and Roman Theatre, types of stages and development of theatre in the West.
- Define *Theatre Terms and Aristotles 6 Elements of Plot*.
- Understand how to direct, block and create a scene from a fairy tale.
- Develop scenes and work in groups to determine blocking areas and types of stages.
- Define Greek Tragedy and work on the first structure of their Greek tragedy project using Aristotles 6 Elements of Plot and a popular Greek Myth.
- Create Greek Tragedy masks. Students will create their own Comedy and Tragedy masks.
- Understand how to work in groups and rehearse and block the tragedy.
- Create exercises to be used during the entire semester for student warm-up. These are used throughout the semester before every class.
- Understand and create pantomimes introduced thorough Lecture and Power Point presentation and video on pantomime and its origins.
- Create original pantomimes and improvs.
- Perform several pantomimes using applied criteria.

## Transfer Goals

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1. Students will be able to effectively communicate specific forms of theatre while obtaining the ability to build confidence and assurance in themselves and to enhance their ability to talk in front of others and convey meaning.
2. Students will be able to work effectively and learn from others in a variety of situations using theatrical techniques and methods.
