- Understand and participate in all aspects of publicity including poster/program design, press releases, press-kits, and fliers.
- Understand the process of developing a costume plot.
- Understand and participate in the process of acquiring, building, altering and maintaining costumes.
- Develop basic costume plots for characters working in groups.
- Develop prop list. Determine buy, rent, make, find. Determine SL and SR needs.
- Set up a prop table.
- Fill prop table with actual or rehearsal props
- Work on making props for play
- Begin work on design projects by reading a one-act play and taking design notes or creating thumbnails.
- Understand how to render set design sketch
- Understand the role of costumes to a production
