Essential Questions

1. How do the history, compositional structure, and aesthetic impact of studied repertoire contribute to the overall development of music?
2. How can understanding the background of a piece enhance its musical performance?
3. How can students effectively evaluate music and other musical performances through critique and analysis?

Knowledge and Skills

- Understand the purpose of journaling/writing compositions about current choral repertoire.
- Evoke emotion that will be drawn from current choral repertoire, based on findings uncovered in current repertoire.
- Critique and analyze a choral work utilizing shared and taught analyzation techniques and determine whether or not the specific repertoire is an exemplary musical work.
- Assess overall choral sound while viewing other performances/listening to their own individual vocal performances.
- Assess and evaluate individual and group choral sound via taught techniques.
