3. What is being evaluated when listening to a performance of music?

Knowledge and Skills

- Daily Use: Sound Innovations, Circle of 4ths, Grade level 4 - 6 music for Wind Ensemble, Instrument, Stands, Whiteboard, Smartboard, Musicfirst Software
- Copy style, articulations, dynamics from player to player.
- Appreciate what role music plays in various cultures and historical eras with an emphasis on music for wind band.
