#### **Unit Summary**

In this unit students will read and spell words with the r-controlled sound /er/ spelled er, ir, ur. Students will use the previously introduced spelling option procedures to determine the correct spelling of words with this sound. Students will read and spell this r-controlled syllable in isolation and combined with other syllable types.
