Unit Summary

In collaboration with <u>Common Sense Media</u>, this lesson helps students learn that many websites ask for information that is private and discusses how to responsibly handle such requests. Students also find out that they can go to exciting places online, but they need to follow certain rules to remain safe.

Student Learning Objectives

Students will learn to...

- Understand that being safe when they visit websites is similar to staying safe in real life
- Learn to recognize websites that are alright for them to visit
- Recognize the kind of information that is private.
- Understand that they should never give out private information on the Internet
- Learn to create effective usernames that protect their private information

Essential Questions

- How do I keep safe on the internet?
- What information should I keep private?

Enduring Understandings

Students will understand that...

- being safe when I visit websites is similar to staying safe in real life.
- a username is a name you make up so that you can see or do things on a website, sometimes called a "screen name."

- how to responsibly handle requests websites make when asking for information that is private.
- follow rules to remain safe when visiting places on the internet.
