Unit Summary

In this unit about Guatemala students will learn at least four facts about the culture and geography of Guatemala. They will be able to identify where Guatemala is located in Central America and the culture of Guatemala. Students will have an opportunity to "visit" the country and explore. As students prepare to demonstrate their knowledge of Guatemala they will have a passport ready for stamping. Students will be inspired to communicate in Spanish and having the opportunity to travel.

Student Learning Objectives

Students learn to...

- locate Guatemala on a map of Central America
- identify unique features of Guatemala, called the "Land of Eternal Spring", famous for weaving.
- identify the natives of Guatemala as Maya
- communicate with peers about Guatemala

- How are peoples' lives the same/different in Spanish-speaking countries?
- How can I better understand when I do not know everything I hear?
- How can I talk to someone in another language when I am just starting to learn it?
- What will help my classmates, my teacher, and others understand me better?

Students will understand that...

- people in other cultures can have many things in common with us, as well as differences.
- it is surprisingly important to listen and observe actively when learning another language.
- they have to be able to do more than answer questions in order to have a conversation.
- they can help classmates and the teacher understand them by using actions and pictures as well as words.
