Unit Summary

Students will be introduced to different styles of drawing as well as drawing media.

- What is the difference between a thoughtless and thoughtful artistic judgment?
- How does creating and performing in the arts differ from viewing the arts?
- When is art criticism vital and when is it beside the point?

Enduring Understandings

- Students understand that the artist's imagination and intuition drive the work, great art requires skills, and discipline to turn notions into a quality product.
- Students understand that the point of studying the arts is to foster meaning making, deeper emotional response, and more inventive decision making.
- Students understand that breaking accepted norms often gives rise to new forms of artistic expression.

Application

- Students will be able to independently use their learning to create various types of drawing such as observational, perspective, blind contour, contour, gesture, expressive, figure/portrait.
- Students will be able to independently use their learning to apply drawing skills such as establishing form, value scales, and line techniques that include crosshatching, stippling, criss-cross, parallel lines, wavy lines, and scribble lines.
- Students will be able to independently use their learning to appropriately use artistic tools and materials such as pencils, markers, color pencil, ink, pens, and scratch boards.
- Students will be able to independently use their learning to create form of composition such as texture, pattern, balance, rhythm, unity.
- Students will be able to independently use their learning to understand the history of art and the artists.

Students will be skilled at:

- Creating expressive drawings using art elements: line, shape, form, color value, space and texture.
- Creating expressive works of art using the principles of design to organize the art including balance, unity, emphasis and rhythm.
- Utilizing line techniques; parallel lines, criss-cross, cross hatching, stippling, scribbling and wavy lines.
- Creating content in drawing that effectively communicates subject matter.
- Identifying themes, symbols and content in drawings.
- Analyzing and evaluating drawings regarding the use of the elements and principles of design.
- Analyzing the impact of time, place and culture on drawings.
