- Students will understand that teamwork and cooperation are skills necessary to attain goals in the classroom individually as well as in groups; this attitude and practice carry over in to real life situation.
- Students will understand that "Two or three heads, are better than one."
- Students will understand that not all groups are created equal and that choice of groups should be considered.
