Unit Summary

In this unit, students will thoroughly review the basic word structure of English words. They will begin with a review of the six syllable patterns that make up basewords. They will look at typical syllables and review some exceptions to the closed and v-e syllable. The students will revisit open syllables and y as a vowel in open syllables. Students will also review the r-controlled and 'd' syllable and the need to use Spelling Option procedures to master many of these words. They will also revisit the final stable syllable patterns with consonant -le and sion/tion welded sounds.
