Unit Summary

In Unit 2, the students will learn the difference between a digraph, blends, digraph blends. Students will learn to blend and segment four, five, or six sounds in a syllable with blends or digraph blends. In addition, the students willlearn the rules for the closed syllable type. Exceptions to the closed syllable type- welded sounds: ind, ild, old, olt, ost.

- Students will learn to read and spell words by blending and segmenting 4 sounds in a syllable.
- Students will learn to read and spell words with closed syllable type.
- Students will learn to read and spell words by blending and segmenting 5 and 6 sounds in a syllable.
- Students will learn to read and spell words with closed syllable exception.
- Students will learn to read and spell words with demonstration words such as shift, shred, script, post, mind.
- Students will learn to read and spell words with high frequency words such as one, for, to, do, you, your, were, where.
