Unit Summary

This unit begins the midpoint of the Just Words program. In Units 8-14, students will master the four remaining syllable types and additional spelling rules. The progress monitoring will now be targeting skills that will be introduced in Units 8-14, thus expect students to begin graphing at lower point and progress upward again. The students will be introduced for the first time to the open syllable.

- How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words?
- How can spelling pattern rules help me with my reading and writing?
