- war and wor.
- -ward and -or as a suffix.
- spelling option procedure for /er/ sound.
- dictionary skills.
- r-controlled exception (rr).
- 1-1-1 spelling rule with r-controlled words.
- uppercase cursive letters: h, k, n, m, d, w.

Essential Questions

How do r-controlled syllables affect the pronunciation of a word?
How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words with r-controlled syllables?
How can spelling pattern rules help read and write unknown words?
How can I use other resources to learn more about words and to check my spelling?

- marking the sounds and syllables of words with the r-controlled vowels ar, er, ir, or, and ur.
- combining **r-controlled syllables** with other syllable types.
- reading and writing words with war and wor.
- recognizing -ward and -or as suffixes.
- applying the 1-1-1 rule with r-controlled words.
- recognizing **r-controlled exception** (rr) when reading and writing words.
- reading and writing homophones: heard, herd, berry, bury, warn, worn
- forming upper case cursive letters: H, K, N, M, D, W
