Unit Summary

In this unit, students will review the soft sounds of \mathbf{c} and \mathbf{g} for decoding and learn how to use the spelling options for encoding. Students will also learn the trigraphs \mathbf{dge} and \mathbf{tch} .

Student Learning Objectives

Students will learn:

- soft sound of c after e, i, y spelling.
- soft sound of **g** after **e**, **i**, **y** spelling.
- English words do not end in j.
- dge after a soft vowel.
- silent **e** spelling rule after soft **g** and **c**.
- uppercase cursive letters: s, i, j .

Essential Questions

What can I do to read an unknown multisyllabic word?
How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words with soft **g** and soft **c**?
How can spelling pattern rules help me with read and spell words with soft **g** and soft **c**?

Enduring Understandings

What can I do to read an unknown multisyllabic word?
How do I spell words that end with the sound v?
How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words with ve at the end of a word?
How can spelling pattern rules help me with writing?

Application

Students will be able to independently use their learning to:

- read and write words with soft c and soft g.
- distinguish between long and short vowel sounds in order to correctly read and write words that end in -dge or -ge.
- apply the silent e spelling rule to read and write words that end in a soft g or c.
- distinguish between meanings in order to read and write sound alike words: cell, sell, peace, piece, cent, sent, scent, scene, seen.
- form uppercase cursive letters: S, I, J.

Skills

Students will be skilled at:

- spelling words with soft c and soft g.
- understanding that English words do not end in the letter j.
- applying the spelling rules spell words with short vowels that end in -dge.
- applying the silent e spelling rule after a **soft g and c**.
- reading and writing homophones: cell, sell, peace, piece, cent, sent, scent, scene, seen.
- forming uppercase cursive letters: S, I & J.
