Unit Summary

In this unit, students will learn glued sounds: ture - capture - /cher/ tu - spatula - /chu/ and how to read and spell words with these sounds. Students will also learn additional letter combinations sounds that say /sh/. ti-patient -/sh/, ci-glacier-/sh/. Finally, you will introduce students to some advance suffix endings: -ous, -al, -ent, -an.

What can I do to read an unknown multisyllabic word?
How do the glued sounds **ture** and **tu** affect the pronunciation of a word?
How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words with the glued sounds **ture** and **tu**?
How can spelling pattern rules help me with writing?

Enduring Understandings

What can I do to read an unknown multisyllabic word?
How do I spell words that end with the sound v?
How do I mark sounds and divide syllables in unfamiliar words with ve at the end of a word?
How can spelling pattern rules help me with writing?

Application

Students will be able to independently use their learning to:

- read and write words with glued sounds ture (capture) and tu (spatula).
- read and write word with Latin connectives that say /sh/: ti (patient) and ci (glacier).
- apply understanding of ti and ci to: read and write words with suffixes: -ous (precious), -al (martial), -ent (patient), -an (musician).
- distinguish between meanings in order to read and write sound alike words: stationary, stationery, eight, ate, straight, strait, side, sighed.
