Unit Summary

Students will explore form by analyzing the patterns and overall structure of individual pieces of music (simple folk songs, large works, etc.). Students will learn how to label form using the letters of the alphabet (ABA) and will strengthen their understanding through listening, singing, composing, reading/writing notation, and movement/dance.

- Does every song have form?
- Can you determine form by listening?
- What are the different type of form?

Enduring Understandings

Students will understand that:

- form is the organization of music, labeled by alphabetized sections.
- form identifies the overall structure or pattern of a song.

Students will be able to independently use their learning to:

- compose an ABA song using Boomwhackers.
- explore form through active listening, movement, singing and playing instruments.
