Unit Summary

Students will learn about how music is organized. We will use patterns, rhythms, listening excerpts, movements, and instruments to explore this concept. Musical concepts such as Form, Mood, Timbre, and Dynamics are a core understanding for students to understand how music is created. Students will create their own compositions, explore new music, and identify form in their own musical genres.
