Essential Questions

- What can digital immigrants teach us about technology?
- How has technology evolved over the years?

- there are characteristics of a strong password.
- technology has evolved so that we live in a "Daily Digital World."
- they are Digital Natives and their parents and grandparents are Digital Immigrants.

Application

Students will be able to independently use their learning to:

- identify strong/weak password.
- write a strong password.
- identify and write safety rules and 'netiquette' rules.
- search the internet for the answer to a given question using keyword search strategies.
- report the Who, What, When, Where of a cyberbullying incident.
- write a citation for sources uses within projects.
