Unit Summary

In this unit, students will review information about being a good digital citizen, and learn about the importance of their digital footprint. In addition, students will take a closer look at dealing with cyberbullying by learning about what other students have done. Students will then demonstrate their understanding of the content in this unit by applying it in the creation of a storybook and presentation.

- identify strategies for dealing responsibly with cyberbullying.
- identify ways other students have stood up and made efforts to stop cyberbullying.
- create a story that teaches others about how to be good digital citizens.

How can people help others to be good digital citizens?

What is cyberbullying, and how do you deal with it?

How can understanding and protecting your digital footprint keep you safe online?

- how information is stored, transferred, and seen on the internet known as a digital footprint.
- how to identify and report cyberbullying .
- various ways they can stand up to cyberbullying.
- how to apply previously learned knowledge and new knowledge about how to be a good digital citizen through story telling.

- identify cyberbullying actions and the roles of the people involved.
- identify various ways to stand up to cyberbullying.
- develop stories from a digital dilemma that demonstrate how to be a good digital citizen.
